




TABLE SCENARIOS (each table choose)

GENERATE IDEAS



All participants generate as many ideas as possible, in silence, for new ways to reach the persona they've selected.

CLUSTER IDEAS



Cluster ideas around themes—move the post-its around so that similar ideas are grouped together. Combine elements of ideas or build on each others' ideas.

Choose which idea has the most potential and / or excitement among the group. This will be the idea you will start fleshing out in the next exercise

Developing the Idea(s)

Each group develops the solution to the idea it has chosen, explaining the concept through drawings, diagrams, or by acting it out.

- Describe target population
- Identify their barrier to census completion
- Walk through storyboard of intervention
- Identify what would need to happen for this to be implemented: What people, resources, materials/capabilities are needed?
- Ask for feedback
