### Q: Is there a minimum amount for requests?

A: No, there is not a minimum amount for requests. Requests for Hearing grants are up to \$150,000. Requests for Vision grants are up to \$150,000. Requests for Substance Use Disorder grants are up to \$25,000. Requests for Heart & Lung grants are up to \$50,000. However, proposals that benefit the community for maximum and considerable impact are ranked higher.

# Q: Can organizations apply for two separate grants if services are provided for both hearing and visually impaired populations?

A: Yes, organizations can submit separate proposals.
