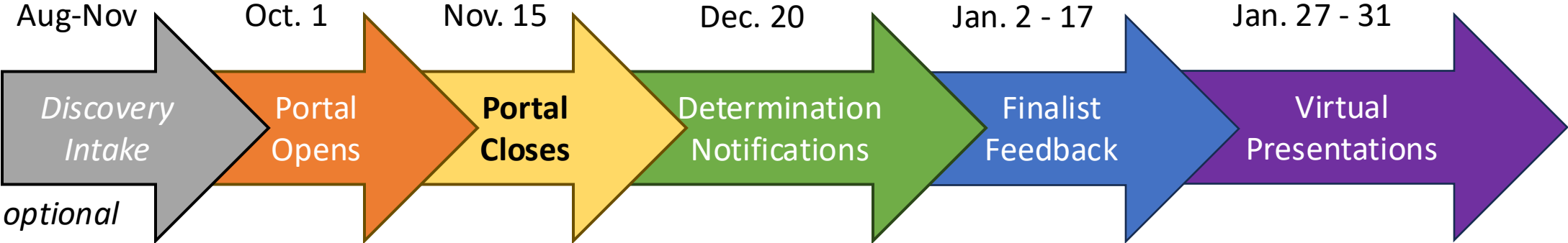
Systems Change Grants

Support coalitions in implementing their desired systems change. By the end of the grant period, coalitions will have either fully implemented or made significant advancements towards their systems change.

Criteria

- **Coalition:** 2+ committed partners w/ roles to achieve systems change.
- **Health Outcome:** Impact on community health issue & “The Wheel.”
- **Systems Change:** Process outlined, ready to implement & achieve.
- **Health Equity:** Engage & benefit those most impacted by the issue.
- **Budget:** Consistent with the scope of work, 3 years & \$175,000, total cost noted w/ other potential funding sources.

 - Summary of Wilder Collaborative Assessment
 - Letters of Commitment
 - Budget Spreadsheet
 - Presentation (as invited)

Systems Change Grant Criteria - Coalition

2+ committed partners w/ roles to achieve systems change.

Specific Points

- Arizona-based coalition formed by 2+ organizations serving the state.
- Lead applicant is an Arizona-serving nonprofit or fiscally sponsored.
- All necessary partners are committed to achieving the systems change.
- The coalition has a history of working together.
- Each partner can describe their role & responsibilities in achieving the systems change.
- The history of the coalition is measured by the Wilder Collaborative Assessment results completed by all core partners.

Systems Change Grant Criteria – Coalition: Wilder

- Select "Register a group."
- Send the link to all core partners.
- Once completed by all core partners, download the summary page.
- Upload the summary page with your written proposal submission.

- Not a typical letter of support.
- A commitment statement from core partners.

Systems Change Grant Criteria – Health Outcome

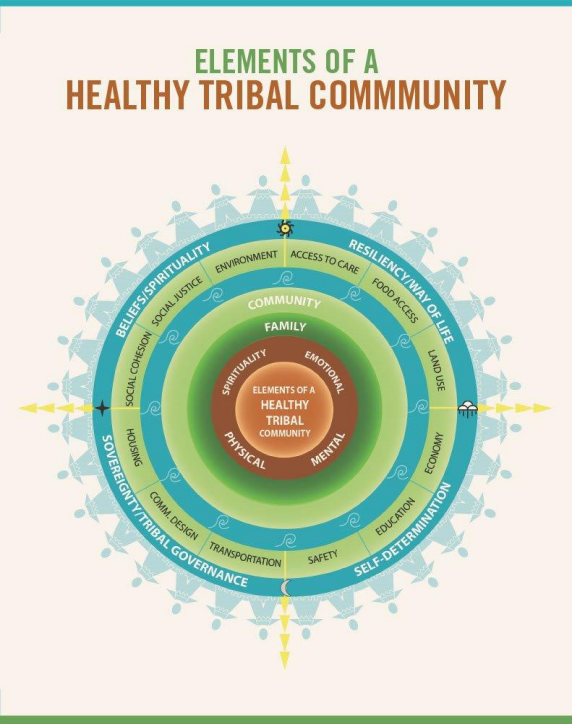
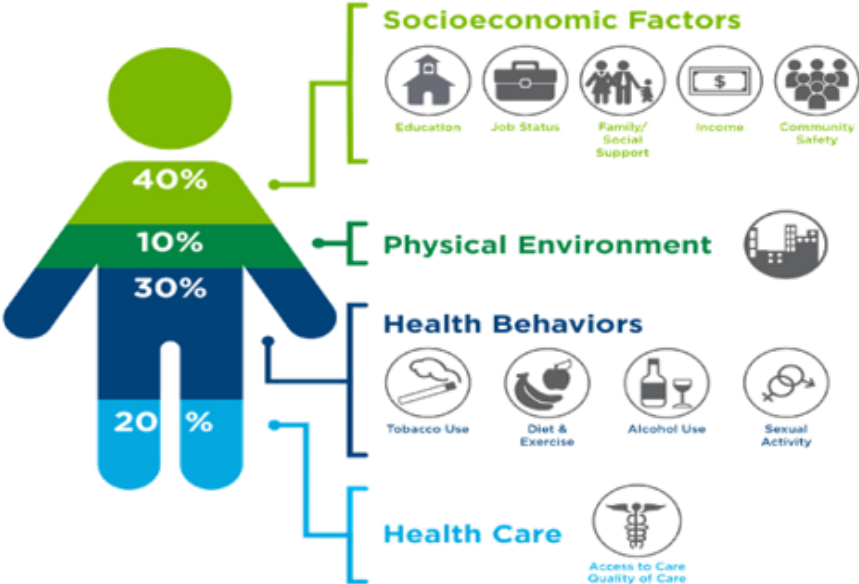
Impact on community health issue & “The Wheel.”

Specific Points

- Identified community health issue.
- Focused on the intersections of the Elements of a Healthy Community.
- Coalition can clearly explain how the proposed change will positively impact community well-being.

Systems Change Grant Criteria – Systems Change

Process outlined, ready to implement & achieve.

Specific Points

- Demonstrate planning already done to position success in accomplishing the proposed systems change within the specific time frame.
- Clearly describe the process of successfully achieving the systems change.
- Clearly describe the readiness to embark on the systems change work.
- The systems change solution is project-oriented & endures after the grant period (e.g., the project is time-bound with tasks to attain a certain outcome).
- The solution is not beginning or continuing programmatic efforts.

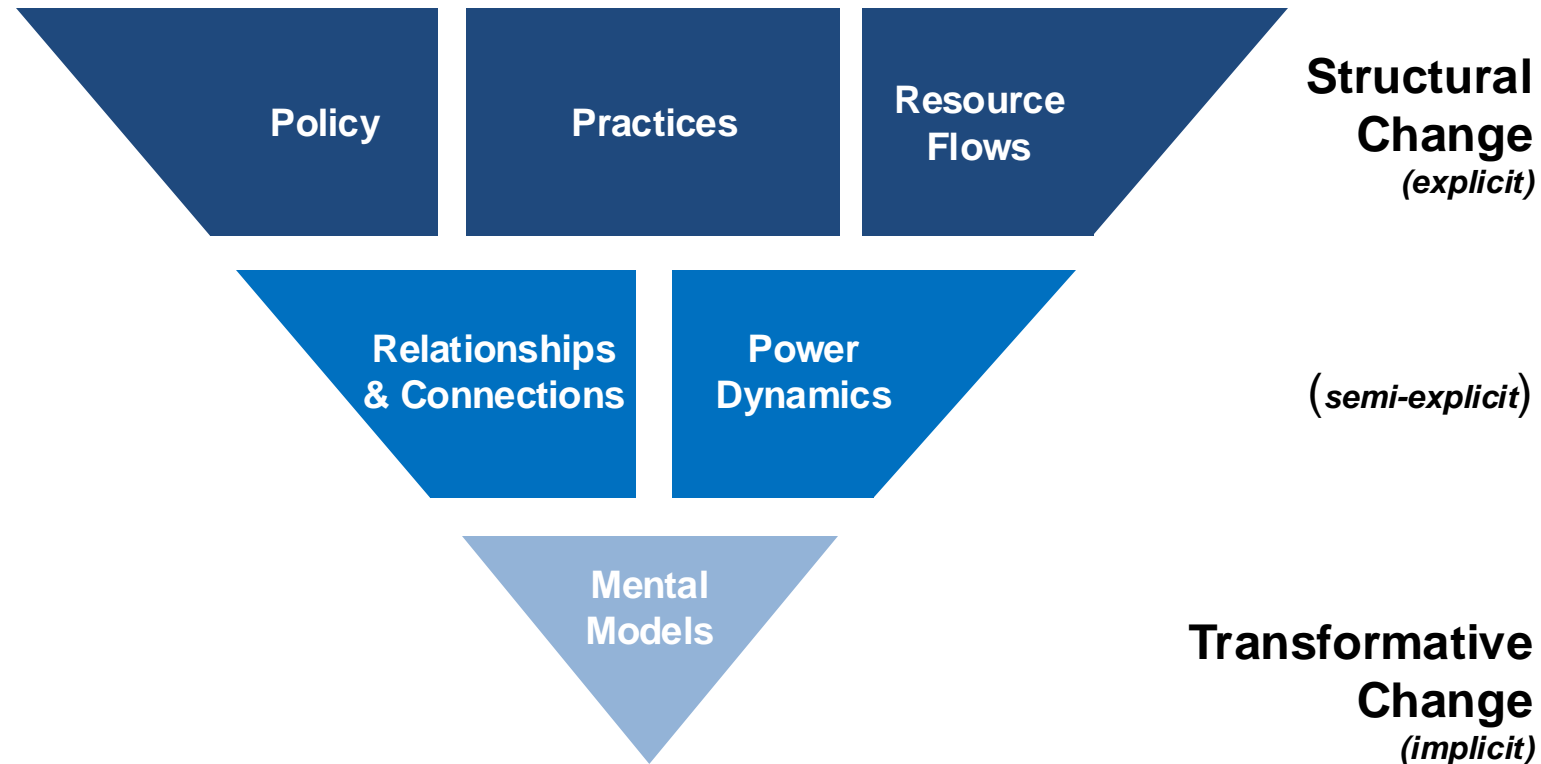

Systems Change Grant Criteria – Systems Change

Shifting the conditions that are holding the problem in place.

Systems Change Conditions



Systems Change Grant Criteria – Systems Change

These conditions represent leverage points in the system, some of which are more explicit than others.

STRUCTURAL CHANGE

explicit

Policies

Government rules, regulations and priorities that guide its and others' actions

Practices

Organizational and practitioner activities that reflect their values and priorities

Resource Flows

How money, people, knowledge and information are allocated and distributed

RELATIONAL CHANGE

semi-explicit

Relationships & Connections

Quality of connections and communication occurring between system players

Power Dynamics

Which individuals and organizations hold decision-making power, authority, influence

TRANSFORMATIVE CHANGE

implicit

Mental Models

Deeply held beliefs and assumptions that influence one's actions

most explicit

most implicit

Systems Change Grant Criteria – Health Equity

Engage & benefit those most impacted by the issue.



Systems Change Grant Criteria - Budget

Consistent with the scope of work, 3 years & \$175,000, total cost noted w/ other potential funding sources.

Specific Points

- 3-year budget totaling \$175,000.
- Budget & narrative is consistent with the proposed scope of work.
- The total anticipated cost of the systems change has been identified.
- Other possible funding sources have been identified.

 - Minimum of 12-point font (Times New Roman, Arial, or Calibri)
 - 1-inch margins
 - Accepted file types: pdf, docx, txt, jpg, png
